The Harvest Festival Pageant Committee would like to thank you for your interest in the upcoming pageant. Please take the time to look over the qualifications and application. We encourage you to contact us with any questions.

Instructions:

- Please complete the application using black or blue ink or by typing your answers.
- You may use the back sides as necessary.

The Harvest Festival Princess application deadline is Friday, July 24, 2024 by 5 pm.

There will be a **mandatory** meeting for all contestants and parent/guardians on **Tuesday**, **August 6 at 5:00 pm** at the Municipal Building (Village Office) in Howard City where we will discuss the pageant agenda, and proper attire for the evening, and answer any questions that you may have. You will also have your picture taken for the pageant program and social media. It is not necessary to wear a dress for this picture as long as attire is appropriate. (This meeting is part of the scoring for the pageant. It is worth 20 points.)

Pageant rehearsal and interview will occur on <mark>Saturday, August 10 at Tri County High School, at 1:30 PM.</mark>

The pageant will be held on **Sunday, August 11 at 4 pm** at Tri County High School, in Howard City. Contestants must arrive promptly at 2:30 pm for dress rehearsal. You should wear your makeup and shoes. You can put your dress on after arrival at the school.

Doors open at 3:30 pm to family, friends, and community members. Tickets are \$2 a piece to help raise money for the Harvest Festival. Each girl will get one complimentary ticket.

Contestants will compete in the following areas of competition.

- Personal interview
- Self-Expression Wear
- On-stage question
- Formal Wear

Contestants and escorts will be introduced to the audience/judges and answer questions from the judges. Please be prepared to answer the following question for the Judges, "Why Do You Want to Represent Howard City as the Princess of Harvest Festival?"

Contestants will be judged on poise, personality, character, speaking qualities, and attendance at the mandatory meeting. At the conclusion of their portion of the program, the Howard City Princess will be named. We would like all contestants to stay for about 15 minutes after the pageant so pictures can be taken.

The Howard City Harvest Festival Princess will receive \$100 upon completion of her reign. Contestants must be 5 years of age at the time of the pageant but not older than 10 years of age by December 1, 2021.

With the application, all contestants must submit a drawing of their own design on 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11-inch paper and a short paragraph about why she would like to be the Harvest Festival Princess.

For parades, the Queen and Court wear Festival dress, sash, and tiara. For other community events, you are to dress appropriately in Harvest Festival T-shirt or

occasionally a nice blouse/shirt, event-appropriate shoes, nice pants (jeans acceptable as long as they are not distressed), sash, and tiara.

The Queen and Court shall determine, plan, and execute a minimum of two community service events. One event will be the Christmastime event at the library and the other is open to ideas from the Queen and Court.

Please discuss the time commitment (parades and community events noted in Contestant Rules and Regulations) with family, employers, and any others who may have expectations of your time throughout the year. Scheduled appearances are mandatory.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR HOWARD CITY FESTIVAL QUEEN AND COURT MEMBERS

<u>Queen and Court Members</u> – will always act as a team while making appearances; will not allow the relationship with each other, or lack of it, to take away from the main focus of being a spokesperson for Howard City.

<u>Families of Queen and Court Members</u> – will be asked to help with rides to various communities for parades/personal appearances and pulling of the float.

<u>Considered Not Appropriate</u> – not showing up to an appearance once it has been planned, showing up late, using profanity, drinking, smoking, inappropriate social media postings, or exhibiting other improper behavior while being Queen or Court Member for Howard City.

<u>Treat Position as You Would a Job</u> – acting as adults, not disgracing Howard City; will be most visible as a leader of Howard City youth.

<u>*Title is About*</u> – how special you can be at representing Howard City; is not a beauty or talent contest; judged upon character, personality, loyalty, and love for Howard City.

<u>Often Will be Actively Involved</u> – announcing, selling tickets, judging, etc. Howard City Harvest Festival Committee reserves the right to dismiss and replace the Queen and/or Court Member if rules are broken. The committee reserves the right to accept or reject applications.

Howard City Harvest Princess Pageant Contestant Rules / Regulations / Code of Conduct

I also attest the following to be true:

1. I have a Howard City or Pierson mailing address and/or telephone number.

2. I am currently attending one of the following which are accredited by the State of Michigan: Tri-County High School, home school, or alternative program.

By signing this code of conduct, I understand and agree:

1. I will attend 90% of scheduled appearances/parades.

2. The method of judging the Harvest Festival Jr Miss Pageant shall be at the sole discretion of the Harvest Festival Pageant judges.

3. In the event that I fail to abide by all of the rules and regulations governing the contest, I will forfeit my position as a Pageant contestant, Harvest Festival Jr Miss, or Court Member.

4. If I am selected as Harvest Festival Jr Miss or Court Member, I promise, to the best of my ability, that my time and cooperation will be to the Harvest Festival Committee. I agree to future public appearances when and where needed unless prior consent from Harvest Festival Committee members is given.
